Erik will give more information about the IJF teams selected during the Namibia Tournament and International matches between JSA and NJ played in July 2022.

What I would like to highlight is the second World Teams that will be selected during the SA Championships in March next year. As of next year, these teams will be selected every fourth year at one of the senior Championships, no matter from which country. At this stage, the plan is during 2027 at the Namibia Tournament. Who knows, *it could be in your country* during 2031?

What is important about the world teams is that the members which will be legible for selection must have represented their countries at National level, for the past four years, at least once a year. The

coaches must have a minimum qualification of level 2. These selections will be the only time that a World Umpire will be selected

I wish you all the best for the coming season.

The AGM of the IJF 24 August 2022



The Annual General Meeting of the IJF took place on 24 August 2022. This virtual meeting was attended by representatives of South Africa and Namibia together with the members of the IJF Exco.

From the respective reports, the following was discussed:

- The Umpire training documents are still outstanding but are already receiving the necessary attention
- Streaming games are a great step forward in promoting jukskei. Thank you JSA for the successful initiative – it was well received by all the players and family at home
- There is a request, if possible, that all matches that are streamed be placed on social media where the countries can watch them for training purposes.

Many changes to the Constitution and the respective Regulations were made:

- A better definition is included regarding the IJF President and COO that they may serve on their country's sub committees
- The process for the application and appointment of Umpires for action during test matches is more clearly defined
- The process regarding approval of proposed rule changes will first be approved at the AGM before it is distributed to the countries. In the past, it was only approved via e-mail between the countries.
- The Participation Regulation has been completely rewritten with the removal of certain Articles and Clauses as well as the addition of new ones.
 - The process for applying to be able to participate internationally (eg test matches, tours or any cross-border visits) is more clearly outlined – from the application to the necessary feedback after the end of the tour or relevant event.
- The Game Rules will only be available in English, but each country is free to change it to its main language
- Some rules have been rewritten to make them easier to understand

The Constitution, Regulations, as well as the IJF Calendar, will soon be available on the Webpage.

Some rule changes to watch out for this season:


- Barrier Line: It is all distance lines on the court that include the side-line.

 Interpretation: note the emphasis here is to stand within the 1.8m mark and not to step into or outside the 1.8m mark.
- · Wooden skeys and wooden pegs can't be used anymore.

It was wonderful to have meaningful discussions. There is a discussion point I would like to highlight:

- Umpire sets are available for new umpires to order directly from Daantjie Stoltz (Jnr) of Flowtec Jukskei (cell 068 527 5538 / flowtecjukskei@gmail.com).
- Tinus mentions that if an umpire's "bubble" of the peg water level, no longer works, the apparatus can be returned to FlowTec for free recovery. The member only pays the necessary courier fees. List of a full set with separate price will

be requested and sent to the various Umpires; members of the Districts/Provinces if there are any orders.

IJF Teams selected 8 July 2022

According to Regulation: Participation, Article 10, IJF teams were selected after the Test Matches played in Swakopmund, Namibia, during the Namibian Tournament.

These teams will be selected from the players participating in that particular championship as well being selected for their Country's National teams. These teams will be finalized and only announced after the final play of the test matches. Teams will consist of five players each. Officials, coaches and Team Managers, will also be appointed. Teams will be selected in four divisions, Senior Men and Women (age 18 years up to 50 years) and men and women above 50 years. All the teams will receive Bronze IJF medals with a plate (IJF Team, and the name of the place played as well as the year).

Players and officials will be dressed in their respective National colours and the skeys and pegs will be painted.

The following teams were selected and received their medals. Due to bad weather, the matches did not take place. We look forward to the announcement of the World Teams, next year in Kroonstad, South Africa. The second after the World Games of 2000 in Swakopmund, Namibia.






July 2022: Monroe, Louisiana USA



With a lot of excitement, I went to the Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (Nairobi, Kenya) on Friday evening 8 July 2022 for my flight to JFK International Airport (New York). This was my 3rd attempt to visit USA, due to Covid-19 restrictions I forced to cancel 2020 and 2021 participation of the World Horseshoe Tournament. This time around I have an added bonus for my trip, I will be representing my country again in an International Jukskei Singles Test Match vs the USA (last test match in April 2019 vs Namibia in Kroonstad, SA). My previous trip in 2018 to the USA I only played a Jukskei Exhibition match for South Africa against the Americans which was

not officially sanctioned by the IJF.

As luck will have it there was some problems for me at Jomo Kenyatta International Airport. First the check in machines went off for five hours which delay my flight and to put the cherry on top of all of it I was bumped off the flight due to overload on the Airplane. Luckily, I was able to book a flight three hours later, but with a few extra stops. I arrived on Saturday (9 July 2022) evening in New York after gruelling 30hours of flight time and airport delays but still I have on Sunday a flight to Monroe Louisiana via Dallas. So, Sunday (10 July 2022) evening Gary Roberts picked me up at Monroe Regional Airport. I was so thankful after spending 48hours of travelling to Monroe to be here.



So, Monday (11 July 2022) was ready for action to play in the World Horseshoe Tournament. All the admin

was done the morning with player check in and shoe weigh in as well. I will be playing after the official Opening Ceremony of NHPA World Tournament 2022. To be hearing South Africa's National Anthem be played first was an honour, even though I was the only South African was great to sing it with much passion as possible (although little bit off tune).

After the ceremony the start of my games began. Still struggling with serious jetlag and travelling fatigue, I was able to win 1 game out of 5 for Day 1, consolation was that I was

at least pitching above my entry % for the tournament. Next day (12 July 2022) was surprised into two media interviews but able to speak little about our sport of Jukskei and how we got involved with Horseshoe pitching. As for the rest of my horseshoe games the next two days went better winning 2 games each day. Even though I finished in middle of the pack in my division it was fun playing and meeting a lot of people and making new friends around the tournament which is very similar to what we experience at SA Jukskei Championships and international tours to Namibia.



On Thursday (14 July 2022) was Jukskei day for me in Monroe. We were scheduled to play Singles tournament (SA and USA players) and a doubles match between South Africa and the USA. Unfortunately, my doubles partner was forced to withdrawn due to Visa issues. So, it was restructure that I was to play a Singles test match vs Gary Roberts of the USA the Thursday (14 July 2022) morning at 9am. As some of the Jukskei players experienced during their visit to Monroe in



2011 playing outside is a challenge as the heat and humidity gets to you quite easily. As we all know is Gary a tough competitor, he would surely pick easy in some our Provincial



Teams in South Africa. I haven't played competitive International Jukskei match since 2019 so it was a little bit daunting for me. The game was close as no one was missing any pens, at the end me missing only one pen in the entire game I was able to lead 17-9 at the end of the match. At least the match drew a small crowd outside. I was able to meet some of the other USA Jukskei players as well afterwards.

So is my week in Monroe coming to an end and Gary dropped me off again Monroe Regional

Airport (Friday 15 July 2022) where I was due to travel to Atlanta Georgia to visit some friends and explore more America. I just want to thank Gary Roberts especially for helping to organise the Jukskei at Monroe and showing me around Monroe and the Tournament. Then further NHPA for helping me at the tournament beforehand and during so that I was looked after there. Then Jukskei SA for giving me the opportunity to represent South Africa against the USA and the IJF for the medals and the sanctioning of the match. Lastly our heavenly Father that kept me safe during my travels so that I can use my talents given to me at the Tournament in Monroe.
