


Coen Brand ATKV Open Day



Namibia Jukskei Strategic Planning

On 22 October 2022, the executive management of Namibia Jukskei held a successful Strategic Planning at the Ramblers Club in Windhoek. A 3-year action plan has been drawn up, which must be reviewed annually with a strategic planning session where each Region, the Juniors, the Referees and Namibia Jukskei Board must give feedback on the progress they have made throughout the year or not, the next strategic planning session will take place in October 2023. Everyone feels incredibly positive about the decisions that were made on the day, and that we must take ownership and help each other to make the project a success.
